## Maine News

Both the towns of **Lyman** and **Orono** are looking for a tax assessor or assessing services. For more information, visit memun.org.

At the **Rockport** town meeting in June, voters will have an opportunity to weigh in on whether they favor an ordinance for regulating short-term rentals.

The **COVID Stimulus Bill** will provide over 500 million to Maine municipalities, which will provide additional revenue over the next two years.

In **Fort Fairfield**, taxpayers are upset with the new assessments stemming from a 2020 revaluation. The first comprehensive reval in 22 years. The angst is not solely on the new values, but the 20% increase in the budget.

**Mid-Maine towns** are submitting letters to the Maine Department of Marine Resources in opposition of an amendment set forth to expand the protection of fish species. If the *Kennebec River Management Plan* amendment passes, several hydro-dams would have to be removed at some time in the near future.

Past Chapter President **Wade Rainey** has retired from his position as the West Paris town manager.

In **Pittston**, the Town warrant includes a town-wide revaluation at a cost of \$200,000, to be spread out over the next 3 years.

Saco and Biddeford have a two step plan for adjustments over the next two years.



## STEP 1. 04/01/2021


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The first step of the plan is to increase all classes of properties to an equitable level based on our projected State Valuation 2022 analysis and to achieve a target ratio where both cities can at least declare a certified ratio of 100%.

## STEP 2. 04/01/2022

Step two will be to collect all necessary cost, market and income data through the help of a revaluation firm with an anticipated target ratio level of 95%. Due to the very limited supply and high demand in the marketplace seen here in this area, I am not comfortable with targeting 100%.

The 95% target level may be adjusted based on what the ratios do from this point on up until 4/1/22. I also believe due to covid that income collection for the 2020 calendar year may have as asterisk and the anticipation of a rebound for many of these businesses is crucial to developing cap rates and NOI's. Some commercial sectors may not rebound to an income level pre covid which I believe will make some adjustments complicated.

# MAINE PROPERTY TAX INSTITUTE, 2021

The Maine Property Tax Division and The Maine Chapter of IAAO online, April 13-14, 2021

> Low-End Residential Properties Valuation of Mobile Home Parks Instructor: Stephen White Cost: \$100 (\$85 for members of Maine Chapter IAAO)



About the courses:

- Low-End Residential Properties: The purpose of this workshop is to provide assistance in the valuation of low-end and difficult residential properties that often create valuation issues. It is not unusual that these types of properties when sold have a sales ratio considerably higher than 1.00 and a very regressive PRD (Price-Related Differential). Discussion and data will center on lower valued residential properties and income and value associated with rental properties. The workshop will conclude with definitions and value issues on manufactured homes, modular homes and odd and unusual homes.
- Valuation of Mobile Home Parks: This one-day workshop is designed to provide historical and current data to assist in the valuation of manufactured home parks. The purpose of the workshop is to provide guidance and suggestions on the process of data analysis and valuation of manufactured home parks or communities. Information from various sources and areas of the United States are used to help establish processes and procedures. Some of the sources include links to the FannieMae database to find properties in your jursidication that have FannieMae loans and some appraisal information associated with the loan. Additional updated expense ratios and forms for collecting property characteristics for valuation purposes. All three approaches to value will be discussed and examples given.


